


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LOGISTICAL INFORMATION



AIRPORT TRANSFERS & TRANSPORTATION

ARRIVAL

Guangxi University has arranged a coach for you to transport from the airport to the hotel. There is only one international terminal in Nanning. Please inform the receptionist that you are a guest of Guangxi University. The drivers are instructed to bring you to your accommodation, no fees will be collected.

DEPARTURE

Transportation from the hotel to the Nanning Wuxu International Airport has also been arranged for you according to your flight schedules. Should there be any changes in schedule, kindly advise the secretariat. Due to the unpredictable traffic in Nanning, we suggest you depart from the hotel 3 hours before your estimated time of departure. Please be reminded that you need to check out before 12:00 at noon before your declared departure date. The car driver will wait for you at the hotel lobby and direct you to the assigned vehicle.

❖ GENERAL TRANSPORTATION ARRANGEMENTS

There are no extra transportation needs during meeting schedule because all delegates' accommodation and meetings are in same site. Transportation of the city tour has also been arranged for the entire group. However, should you require ground transportation outside the program schedule, assistance maybe requested from the hotel concierge or the secretariat. Located in the bank of Yong River, completed in December, 2008 and opened to the public on May 1, 2009, the Anthropology Museum of Guangxi (AMGX) is a topic museum focusing on displaying their ethnic culture. Now it is a national first grade museum, National Civilized Unit and National Unity and Progress Education Base.

Its architecture covers an area of 33,000 m². At present, it has 35,000 pieces (sets) of collections, containing ancient bronze drum, ethnic dresses, weaved brocade and embroidery, livelihood and production tools, folk handicrafts and folk residence, and many more. Within it there are six permanent exhibitions: the Bronze Drum Culture Exhibition, the Colorful Guangxi-Guangxi Ethnic Culture Exhibition, the Zhuang Culture Exhibition, the Chinese Culture Exhibition for Nationalities, the Colorful World--Exhibition of International Ethnic Culture Collection and Yesterday Once More--Century Old Items Exhibition.

In recent years, its annual average visitors has been 700,000.





1. UNIVERSITY OF BRUNEI DARUSSALAM

The Design and Creative Industries (DCI) programme in Universiti Brunei Darussalam offers undergraduate and graduate degrees. Based in the Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences (FASS), DCI offers a wide range of interdisciplinary disciplines in the areas of art, design and media, innovation and technology and business and management in collaboration with the Faculty of Integrated Technologies and the UBD School of Business and Economics. There is a teaching gallery, a kiln room, art studios and a spacious surrounding area for students to work in. A gallery is also available on campus for exhibition of final-year student artworks, as part of an annual art and design graduation show, "Spectacle", which is open to the public. As part of the DCI programme requirements, students also put on a short film festival of documentaries, experimental film, and animated film. In 2018, our students won the Short-list Award for Best Public Service Advertisement at the 11th Shanghai Student Television Festival.

The English and Malay studies programme in UBD-FASS also offer modules in creative writing for the genres of short stories, poetry, life writing and scripts. In previous years, student work has been published in an anthology of scripts edited by faculty, and exhibitions on local oral tradition and folklore have been held as part of the requirements of the Malay and English studies programmes.

Apart from the academic degree programme, there is a strong extra-curricular culture of creative production and industry at UBD FASS. Among these is a UBD Art Club run by the DCI-major students which frequently organises cultural and art activities, often involving and inviting industry stakeholders. The UBD Performing Arts Club regularly puts up original theatrical productions, produced, directed and written entirely by students, with occasional consultation of faculty staff, selling tickets to the public. There are also active writing communities in Malay and English.

Most recently in April 2019, UBD-FASS hosted a symposium on "Understanding the Creative Industry Ecologies in Brunei and Hong Kong" in collaboration with the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK). Papers on the cultural and creative industries were presented by researchers from both universities, and a roundtable featuring a panel of local creative industry stakeholders was held as part of the symposium.

SPECTACLE 2019



School of Arts, Guangxi University

Guangxi University has a long tradition of arts education. When Mr. Ma Junwu held the position of the first President of Guangxi University from 1928, he advocated and carried forward the doctrine of "Truth, Goodness and Beauty", and himself created a large number of poems and articles, which have been engraved in the sculpture garden of the university today. As early as 1936, in the Yanshan Park campus of Guilin, Jiao Juyin, Ouyang Yuqian, Ding Xilin and a large number of other famous dramatists were employed as professors to instruct the students in artistic activities, thus forming the valuable tradition of attaching the utmost importance to artistic creation and aesthetic education.

Guangxi University established the Arts Teaching and Research Office in 1997, followed by the Arts Department in September 2007, and School of Arts on October 31, 2008. At present, the School of Arts has 79 faculty members, 75 of whom are officially enrolled and 62 of whom are full-time teachers. Among them, there are 4 persons with professorial title, 24 with associate professorial title, 1 with "Bagui Scholar" title, awarded to high-level leading talents in Guangxi. 10 faculty members have been awarded Ph.D. degree and 10 are doctoral candidates. 57 faculty members have been awarded Master's degree. This means 68 percent of all the teachers own master's degrees or above.

The School of Arts has six undergraduate majors, namely Music, Fine Arts, Dance, Environmental Design, Visual Communication Design, as well as Theatre Film and TV Literature. At the same time, it has set up a special research institution for Children's Drama and Campus Drama Creation and Research. The School has one accreditation point for MFA (including three main areas: Music, Design and Drama), and one accreditation point for Master's degree in second-level discipline Aesthetics (subject to the first-level discipline of Philosophy). The School now has 988 undergraduates and 26 graduate students, totaling 1014.

Since 2014, the School of Arts has carried out 28 scientific research projects, including 7 national-level projects (5 projects supported by National Social Science Fund of China and 2 by China National Arts Fund). The School has won more than ten national, ministerial and provincial-level awards including "Taoli Cup" National Dance Competition, the first prize of National College Students' Art Performance, as well as the "Bronze Drum Prize" of Guangxi Literature and Art Creation. A drama work has been enlisted into "National Key Creations of Stage Art" issued by the Ministry of Cultural and Tourism of the People's Republic of China.

Relying on the abundant resources of Guangxi University, which is the only higher education institution in Guangxi belonging to the National "211 Project", the School of Arts has benefited greatly from the national investment in universities in central and western regions of China. It is today part of the plan of the university to establish world-class academia and the co-construction of Guangxi University by Guangxi Province and Chinese Ministry of Education. The School of Arts has

endeavored to practice the university motto of "Diligence, Sincerity, Profound Learning and Innovation", striving to consolidate the foundation of teaching and research, build more academic platforms, enhance its comprehensive strength, seek for a characteristic route of development in order to become first-class among its peers. It takes advantage of the rich cultural and artistic resources of ethnic minorities in Guangxi and the geographical-cultural relationship between China and ASEAN countries in order to cultivate art specialists with local, national, international and innovative knowledge, also featuring cross-disciplinary exploration spanning the fields of humanities, science and engineering.









3. YUNNAN UNIVERSITY

There are six faculties with two theoretic disciplines in the School of Arts and Design at Yunnan University, namely fine arts, musicology, environment design, visual communication design, digital media arts design and fashion design. The two theoretic disciplines are artistic theory and that of fine arts.

From the time it came into being 20 years ago when the university cooperated with the Malaysia International Design Group to found one of the earliest schools of design in China, the School of Arts and Design has established strong and close links to both domestic cooperation with top universities in China and international programming exchanges in many fields, involving gallery tours, construction of courses, journal development, minority ethnic visual-ology researches and so on. A recent case in point is the Training Program for the Preservation and Heritage of Ceramic Technology in Yunnan Province. In this program, teachers and students from the School of Arts and Design traveled inside the mountainous area, worked together with the local craftsmen, gave full play to their creation and artistic theories, and thus holding successfully the exhibitions of excellent ceramic works and visual photographic proceedings.

Apart from these, students in the School of Arts and Design have actively annual exchanges with students around Asia. Each summer semester, students who major in Musicology travel to Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok for International Thai Culture Camp; and in winter one, teachers and students from Dhaka University of Bangladesh jointly held lectures and art galleries either in Yunnan University or Dhaka University.

Besides, the School of Arts and Design has kept well cooperating with a South Korean university to publish music journal, Asian Musicology. The Secretariat of the Asian Music Institute, the Oriental Music Institute and Audiovisual Ethnomusicology of ICTM are all located in the School of Arts and Design, which has also cooperated with Hong Kong Polytechnic University to establish an art design and social development center.





4. UNIVERSITAS GADJAH MADA INDONESIA

Cultural Practices such as Batik Making, Playing Gamelan Music and Traditional Dancing have become part of the Faculty of Cultural Sciences Curriculum. During their study, students of the faculty has to take at least one of those classes which worth 3 credits.



A part from those compulsory classes, students can also join Semi-Outonomous Students Organizations focus on Indonesian Culture and Arts; photography, theatre, poetry reading, etc.



Each student organization is given US\$ 700 per year to manage their practices, joining competition, or held an exhibition. Another US\$ 300 will be awarded to the organization that is willing to carry out a research on Indonesian culture and arts. Throughout the year, the faculty members act as supervisors and assessors for these organizations. Should any of the organizations take part in a national or international events or competitions, the Faculty and University support them in terms of fund and facilities. Many of those organization have won awards from various countries such as; Malaysia, Korea, Singapore, etc.

5. UNIVERSITAS AIRLANGGA

UNAIR is one of Indonesia's leading universities and a prominent center of higher education in the eastern part of Indonesia. Strengthening our Tri Dharma Perguruan Tinggi (the three duties as a higher education). First, we conduct a learning process which is supported by qualified academics, researchers, and students across the fields, ranging from health science, life science, and social science. Second, we joint research activities on continual bases, with the understanding that knowledge and experience can be learned from anyone. Third, we accomplish community development by upholding community services, offering training and workshops, performing facilitation for the community as well as for the government in our three main areas of competence: health science, life science, and social science. Since our faculty is learning about humanities, the courses that offered are about humanities as well. The courses are called *Mata Kuliah Wajib Fakultas* or Required Courses. Students can also join such nurturing activities which is held by some goups or community below the faculty supervision, named BSO (Badan Sie Otonom). The community consists of spirituality, music, and drama by a bunch of students. Meanwhile for the internationalization, Faculty of Humanities Universitas Airlangga holds an exchange student program which serve our cultural activities, such as membatik or painting the batik and playing the leather puppet called wayang.

Thus, the main focus of the campus is indeed to improve academic quality over the time. Globalization is not considered an obstacle but rather as an opportunity to carry out the development of education, research, and a variety of community services.

In general, UNAIR wishes to vontribute to and thrive at an international level without leaving the values of nationalism.

6. UNIVERSITAS INDONESIA

Art and culture activities at Universitas Indonesia are under auspices of Subdirectorate of Development and Empowerment of Art and Culture, Directorate of Student Affairs. Although Universitas Indonesia (UI) has no specific faculty related to art, yet UI supports our students to learn and to embrace their potentials in so many branches of art, as much as we do in sports, of course without any ignorance in our main goals to develop our students academic potentials as well. Beside the awareness to give sufficient facilities for our students to help them enjoy with their hobbies and potential development, UI also puts our attention to the development of potentials student clubs.

In the end of 2018, UI has inaugurated a new student activity building that expected could support more activities in campus. The new building have an auditorium with capacity up to 600 guests and practice rooms for orchestra, dance, choir and theatre club. Not to mention Makara Art Center particularly dedicated for commercial performance.

7. UNIVERSITY OF MALAYA

'In the search for material progress, unless there is a counterbalance on the cultural side of national life, ultimately, the newly-found material enjoyments will become like tasteless fruits and aroma-less flowers'

 Royal Professor Ungku Abdul Aziz, 'Orientation of Arts and Science Education to meet national and regional needs', Workshop on Role of Universities in National Development Planning in Southeast Asia held at the Regional Institute of Higher Education and Development, Singapore, 26-29 July 1971.

At the University of Malaya, art is more than a song-and-dance. It is an aesthetic cure to a materialist view of the world. It is about meaning-making, finding oneself amongst others. Therefore, the university's engagement with art and culture has always been adaptive, responsive, and dynamic.

With the establishment of University of Malaya in 1949, art history was one of the first few subjects on offer at the founding campus in Singapore. Nevertheless, the teaching of art history was not offered in KL when a second autonomous campus was established up north. The university art museum collection however was split between the two campuses, with the KL half finding a home in 1980 with the opening of the University's *Muzium Seni Asia*.

The University of Malaya's inclusion of the arts in its strategic planning began in 1970, with the establishment of the Culture Unit. The unit's responsibility was to organise and promote arts and culture to the campus community and surrounding public. Ungku Aziz recognised in the arts a cure to address the 'alienating influences that may be inherent in their respective specialised educational fields'.

Meanwhile, the Great Hall and Old Chancellery Building at University of Malaya (currently home to the Cultural Centre) became a historic venue for the convening of a National Cultural Congress in 1971. The formulation of the National Cultural Policy during the congress paved way for the establishment of the Cultural Centre at the University of Malaya in 1975. The promotion of the arts in campus cultural life complemented the research and study of local/regional artistic forms across many disciplines (Malay Studies, Southeast Asia, History, Chinese Studies, English Literature, Anthropology, etc.). This helped to enliven student's university experience.

From 1997 onwards, the Cultural Centre expanded to offer programmes in dance, theatre, drama and later visual art. These programmes encourage the study of artistic practice through rigorous research. Besides running an active program on campus, which includes staging plays, exhibitions, music concerts and dance performances – the Cultural Centre has established strong partnerships with cultural institutions around the world

Adapting flexibly and critically to changes in what we understand to be arts and culture, the Cultural Centre is currently embarking on a research and public engagement project with British Council and Yayasan Sime Darby on 'creative hubs in Malaysia', with the expressed intention of working alongside many active student bodies on campus to create a hub on campus in the near future.

The museum has provided index for searching and copied as digital system including saving data on database in computer. Moreover the museum also copied both of broadcasted works and not broadcasted ones to sort at the museum and classified them by type of Thai music band under the name of " Sam Sieng Lae Rieng Roi (ตามเพียงและกับบร้อย ."(Then the museum had disseminated them as CD for 91 pieces. Beside these works, reviving band and Thai Music Recording works of Professor Prasit Thaworn also were recorded by museum under name of "Phra Lor" and "Plern Pleng Pard Ranard Aek" which were played by Professor's student. Furthermore museum also created a valuable cultural event such as to pay respect to Thai Music and Art and Cultural professors, Cultural Summer Camp for youth, Thai music standard Seminar, Sing and dance at Thai house or Thai Circle Exhibition. Moreover this museum was a place for study and doing research, disseminating and preserving Thai musical culture including music from other each region, each ethnic in Thailand and countries in Southeast Asia.






ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE OF CAN THO UNIVERSITY

The Ho Chi Minh City University of Social Sciences and Humanities (or the USSH) boasts a 60-year history of establishment and growth. After the 1954 Geneva Accords, the University was founded in Saigon, but its origins go back to the Hanoi University of Letters. The University's predecessor, the French Preparatory College of Letters in Saigon as an affiliate member of the Vietnam National University (later changed into the University of Saigon), was founded in November 1955.

On March 1st 1957, the Faculty of Letters, part of the University of Saigon, was officially established. From 1976 till 1996, the Faculty of Letters matured into one of the two component members of the Ho Chi Minh City University, covering social sciences and humanities.

Pursuant to Decision No 1233/QD-BGD&DT signed by the Minister of the Ministry of Education and Training Tran Hong Quan, the University officially bore the name of the University of Social Sciences and Humanities, Vietnam National University-Ho Chi Minh city on March 30th 1996.

The activities concerning to Culture and Arts programming in the campus

Our students actively participate in arts performances and cultural exchanges in international activities. Many programs have been designed to welcome international delegations (faculty and students) to USSH for cultural exchange and to participate in socio-cultural studies in Vietnam. Besides those, our students often participate in forums, youth festivals, international student festivals: Every year, many students are invited to attend forums and festivals in such countries as Japan, Korea, Russia, Singapore, Thailand, India, China, etc. Typical programs are: with over 5,500 turns of enrollments per year for long-term, short-term courses and for research (the Vietnamese language, Vietnamese culture, Vietnamese history, field trips, homestay, etc.; BA, MA courses on

Vietnamese Studies); USSH students often organize cultural exchange activities with foreign students of the Faculty of Vietnamese Studies; thereby, helping the process of integration and study of foreign students become better. Especially, every year, the Faculty of Vietnamese Studies organizes Vietnamese Culture Festival, contributing to connecting the world cultures with Vietnamese culture.
